

## Selection criteria for Medicine at Ulm University

The allocation of places is based on a ranking list in which a maximum of 100 ranking points can be achieved:

### Higher education entrance qualification – a maximum of 46 ranking points

In order to make the overall average grade in the *Abitur* (general higher education entrance qualification) more comparable in terms of difficulty and assessments, hochschulstart.de determines the ranking points in the AdH (*Auswahlverfahren der Hochschulen*; higher education institutions' own selection procedures) on the basis of the percentile ranking procedure for the top performers in the *Abitur* (*Abiturbestenquote*)

### TMS – a maximum of 44 ranking points

The points achieved by the applicant *Points TMS<sub>A</sub>* are calculated as follows:

$$\text{Points } TMS_A = \frac{TMS \text{ weight}}{2} + \frac{TMS \text{ standard score } A - 100}{10} * \frac{TMS \text{ weight}}{6}$$

The following applies: 0 points for TMS standard score (*Standardwert*) < 70

$$TMS_{\text{weight}} = 44$$

*TMS standard score<sub>A</sub>* is the result that the applicant achieved in the TMS.

### Completed vocational training

**One or more** recognised vocational trainings yield 6 ranking points.

### Services/voluntary work

**One or more** recognised services/voluntary work yield 2 ranking points.

### Prizes

**One or more** recognised prizes yield 2 ranking points.

Vocational training, work experience, special educational qualifications or subject-related practical activities as well as extracurricular activities that were acquired/ practised abroad may be recognised as equivalent.
