About the Form

- CV, transcript of records, certificates for honorary work or other documents in favour of the nominee may be submitted along with the nomination form (but are not compulsory).
- The nomination form may be scanned and submitted via e-mail.

Target Group

The award may only be given to so-called „**Bildungsausländer*innen**“ (educational foreigners). Bildungsausländer*innen are international students who received their higher education entry qualification in a country other than the country they are currently studying in, i. e. at a school abroad (German schools abroad included), or who supplemented their academic qualifications acquired abroad by a German “Studienkolleg” (preparatory college). The students (including PhD) need to be enrolled in a course of study at Ulm University with the aim of earning a degree.

They stand out due to:

- (1) **excellent academic achievements** and
- (2) **remarkable social or intercultural commitment.**

If possible, they should be in an advanced stage of their bachelor’s/master’s programme; however, recent graduates or PhD students may be nominated as well.

The DAAD prize is **not a research award and is not intended for honouring a PhD thesis.**

Each student may receive the award **only once**. As a rule, the prize **cannot be shared** between multiple students.

The award winner may simultaneously be supported financially by another German institution, a foundation or a company (please note in this context „Aim of the Award“ below). However, the prize may **not be awarded to a student/graduate who received a scholarship funded by the DAAD or other public funds in the same year.**

Aim of the Award

The award of the DAAD Prize should show the general public how foreign students enrich the German university community. Another goal is to reward students and PhD candidates who are mastering their studies on their own and do not receive any other form of support.
