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General Course Information		
Language of instruction	 German and English In general, the language of instruction is German. Most study programmes offered at Ulm University are German-taught programmes. However, there may be select courses taught in English even in German study programmes. In addition, there are currently 12 Master programmes taught completely in English. Medicine and Dentistry are strictly taught in German (including exams or clinical electives). Students wishing to do a project or thesis in any of the other subject areas do not need to prove proficiency in German, as long as they have sufficient command of English. 	
Admission to Master level courses	 Students should have successfully completed at least 3 years of study (approx. 180 ECTS) All students must meet the linguistic and academic requirements of any given course. 	
Courses from other departments and faculties	 Students are expected to select the majority of courses and/or credits from the subject area corresponding to that at their home institution. They may choose up to two courses per semester from study programmes in other departments/faculties. Admission to courses in other departments/faculties can be restricted, giving priority to degree students and students coming over a direct agreement with that particular department. In addition, students may take courses from the School of Humanities (language courses, philosophy, soft skills). Courses from career-integrated programmes or the continuing professional education programmes offered by the School of Advanced Professional Studies (SAPS) are not open to exchange students.

Language requirements	 We expect students to have at least level B2 in the language of instruction / working language. If students wish to take classes in both English and German, both languages must be certified. Students who have only level B1 in German at the time of application may be accepted under the condition that they participate in the Intensive German Language Course prior to the beginning of their studies (September/March) Students wishing to do practical work in a hospital (elective/clerkship/rotation) must prove that they have min. level B2 in German at the time of application.
